Shanna recently posted an update of his condition and this is what she wrote:

They say a photo can say a thousand words... yesterday was the 6 month anniversary. We went to the doctor this week . They are very impressed with his recovery, the large bones still have about a year to go to close . We won't

have another appointment for 2 months so , I believe this will be the last update we are good... actually great! David is

now walking short distances with / without a cane we are back to going to the Y 5 times a week ... Thank you all for the messages , cards, meals , the ramp, the concern and love we have felt during this entire event . Love to you all.

A True Guilford County Revolutionary War Hero

In the fall of 1781, a band of Tories set up an encampment in the area of the mountains of North Carolina called the Barrens. At night, they would raid neighboring farms stealing livestock, food, and other provisions. They were known to prey on those Whig families who were rumored to be weak in their convictions in an effort to try to persuade them to assist them in their efforts on behalf of the king.

Understandably, the local militia wished to rid the area of these marauders but did not know where to find them. One night while on a mission to gather intelligence, a group led by Captain John Williams stopped by the McBride farm to see if the family knew anything that might help them. Hantz and his oldest son Isaiah were not home as they were off fighting, so Mrs. McBride warily greeted the soldiers until she learned why they had come. Eager to help, she began to describe what rumors she had heard and attempted to give directions to the soldiers.

Maggie and her siblings had been in the Barrens numerous times and knew it well as they had played there; they took the cattle to graze there, and they picked wild grapes there, so Maggie knew it was an area easier to navigate than to describe. As a girl of about twelve, Maggie knew it was not

her place to interrupt her mother, but fearful of what might befall the soldiers if she did not, she would jump into the conversation here and there adding further description or correcting her mother's directions.

Realizing that this young girl was a wealth of knowledge, the captain



asked if she would ride with them and show them where to go. At first Maggie grew silent, appraising the danger that might await them, but her dedication to being of service to the Patriots' cause won out. With assurances of protection given by the captain to her mother, Maggie was given permission to go with the troops. She quickly climbed upon the captain's horse, sitting behind him, and directed the troops as to where to go.

As they slowly approached the

area that she thought the Tories to be, voices could be heard coming from the dense vegetation. Maggie pointed and whispered, "Over there!" before she quickly dismounted and began running for home. She had not gotten but a few yards before the captain's men had charged into the Tory camp and gunshots and sword fight rang in Maggie's ears. She ran harder and faster for home, finally arriving safely to tell her mother and siblings about what she had seen and heard that night. As a result of that night's raid, that band of Tories was soundly defeated and run out of the Barrens, never to return.

Are you as smitten and impressed with Maggie McBride as I am? Stop and ask yourself if the preteen version of yourself would have so hastily or willingly answered such a call to action as Maggie did. Putting the safety of the militia men ahead of her own, she literally and figuratively led the charge for our young nation.

As you can imagine, Maggie continued to grow into a fine young, principled woman and in December of 1796, she married Robert Shaw Stewart, a soldier in the American Revolutionary War. He was the son of Finley Stewart and Prudence Shaw Stewart. The Stewarts were another Alamanace Church family with Scots Irish roots. Maggie and Robert

Park Updates: Invasive Plant Treatment, Storms Of Summer, Etc.

In late June, a crew from Ripple EcoSolutions battled the intense summer heatwave over the span of two consecutive days

sensitive to its oils.

Notable work involved the first treatment on *Microstegium vimineum* (Japanese stilt grass) that we have

as they treated a variety of invasive plants (English Ivy, Porcelainberry, Liriope, Japanese Honeysuckle, Privet, Wintercreeper, etc.) that had again begun to take hold in the Sunset Hills park areas after a 2 year break from management of invasives. This summer, Ripple EcoSolution's scope of work was from "curb to curb" instead of focusing solely on the stream edges. We also requested they treat Poison ivy to render the park friendlier for children and for residents who walk their dogs throughout the natural areas.

While Poison ivy is a native, it is not one that is endangered and most people are highly

covered an area so wide that pulling was not effective.) This highly invasive grass has spread widely throughout the Southeast and is now found all over NC. Stilt grass quickly spreads and forms a large colony which smothers almost all other vegetation making it difficult for our existing indigenous species (whether plant, insect, or animal) to survive as this plant offers no benefits to our native flora and fauna. Even deer turn up their noses at it!

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How To Make The Strawberry Spinach Salad

Ingredients

- 2 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 tsp. Dijon mustard
- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 2 rotisserie chicken breasts, shredded or cut into 1/2" pieces
- 1/4 small red onion, thinly sliced
- 5 cups packed baby spinach (about 5 oz.)
- 2 cups thinly sliced strawberries
- 3/4 cup coarsely chopped toasted pecans, divided
- 5 oz. feta, crumbled

Directions

1. In a large bowl, whisk lemon juice and mustard. While whisking, slowly pour in oil until smooth and emulsified; season with salt and pepper.
2. Add chicken, onion, spinach, strawberries, and 1/2 cup pecans and toss to combine.
3. Pile salad onto plates. Top with remaining 1/4 cup pecans and a generous crumbling of feta

Storage

Like most salads, this strawberry spinach salad is best eaten day-of or within a day or so, but the dressing can be made up to 5 days in advance and stored in the fridge in an airtight container or jar. If you intend on bringing this into work for lunch (you'll be the talk of the office) or if you have leftovers, I recommend keeping the dressing on the side until just before you eat the salad.

joyful...) years until one day she questioned similarities in penmanship that felt a bit too close to home. (Reader, you can fill in the blanks). Margot was eight. Anniwho, soon after, Margot's fairy house found a temporary resting place in our garage.

It sat for nearly two years during home renovations, new-found, age-related activities and more UNTIL she recently resurrected the house. With growing excitement Margot devised a plan to share the same experiences with neighborhood children that her fairies shared with her. We dusted off the little house, gave the roof a new coat of paint and gathered goodies to fill the in-

side. But before we had a chance to make a neighborhood announcement, and to our surprise, the 'Fairies' started visiting again-



Items began appearing around the house, a gold leaf crown placed

atop and a stained-glass butterfly hanging from the roof. Margot questioned my whereabouts each day these gifts were left behind, but I promise I had nothing to do with them. raising nine children to adulthood. Margaret McBride Stewart died September 30, 1846, at the age of seventy-seven. Both Maggie and Robert are buried in the Alamance Church cemetery alongside other members of the Stewart family.

Finley Stewart, Maggie's father-in-law, is a verified DAR Patriot, and he and Robert both have had their graves marked with DAR markers for their service in the American Revolutionary War. Maggie is ALSO a verified DAR Patriot. Her great-granddaughter's application to join a North Carolina Chapter was submitted and verified in 1925. This great-granddaughter is the only DAR member to have claimed Maggie as a Patriot thus far. However, thirty-eight verified applications are attached to Robert Stewart and Margaret McBride as a descendant generation through Robert being a child of Finley Stewart. The most recently verified one being from May of 2024. This means that Maggie's descendants have also been members of DAR chapters in California, Florida, Louisiana, New York, Ohio, Oklahoma, Texas, and Virginia.

To our knowledge, there are currently no statues or monuments honoring Maggie; however, numerous texts about the impact on the American Revolutionary War in North Carolina, and in

particular those from Guilford County, share the story of Maggie McBride. At one point, Maggie McBride and her heroism were a required element to be taught per the North Carolina Social Studies Curriculum for elementary students. There was even a poem, albeit not a fabulous one, written about her and included in a collection of North Carolina themed poems for children.

This year the Maggie McBride Chapter, NSDAR, will be placing a DAR marker on Maggie's grave in the Alamance Presbyterian Church cemetery.

SHNA are consulting with the owner of Ripple EcoSolutions to develop and plant a riparian stream buffer seed mix for planting this fall. The goal is to replace bare soil areas and sections with high concentrations of stilt grass with native species that can out-compete invasive plant species and provide greater ecosystem services in our park. This custom seed mix will add additional plant diversity for pollinators, will stabilize the stream banks protecting

them from erosion during heavy rains, and will be beautiful as well!

Heavy rains and winds from storm systems have been frequent in 2025 bringing our rain totals for the year to 6.5" above normal through July. Gardeners are always grateful for the rain...and all of us who planted the 128 native tree saplings in November of 2024 for the Centennial are no exception! At last count, all but 3 or 4 of the trees have survived and are growing! This is especially comforting considering the heavy loss of trees that the park (and surrounding yards) have sustained from these same storms. I am sure that I am not alone in believing that intensive effort to reforest these natural areas was timely, important, and a wonderful bonding experience for everyone who came out that day.

Stewarding our beloved park is an ongoing effort and we are fortunate to have a steadfast commitment from our SHNA, SHEA, the Sunset Hills Garden Club, as well as a "squad" of neighbors. Discussions are beginning to occur regarding what to plant (trees or shrubs or both) near the tennis court where several large trees fell this summer. If these types of activities or discussions are of interest to you, join us! Watch the neighborhood listserv for meetings and volunteer opportunities as they arise.
