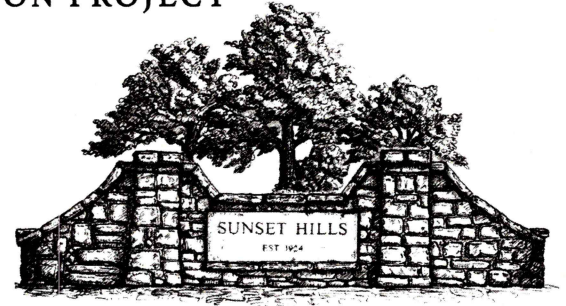


# SUNSET HILLS

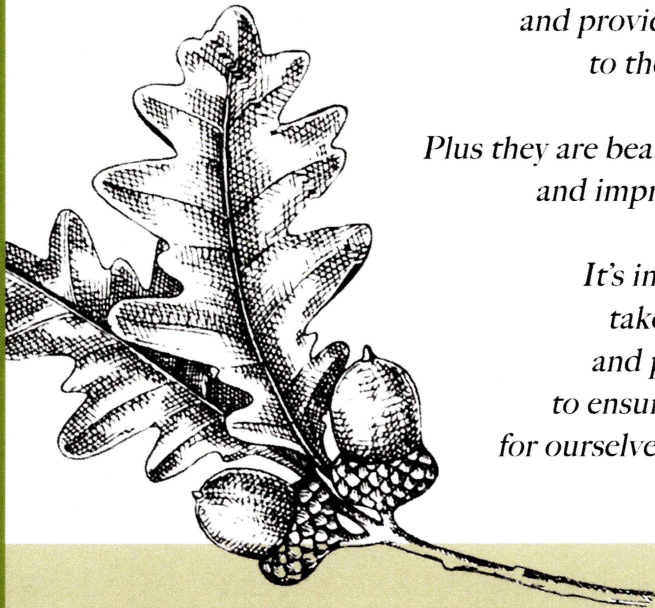
*did you know that trees ...*

to the wildlife we love!*

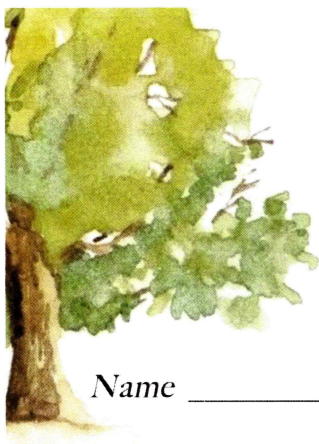
*Plus they are beautiful, increase property values,

for ourselves and future generations.*



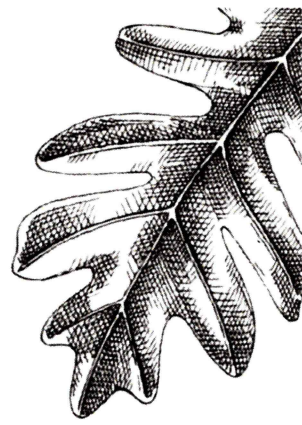
### HOW IT WORKS

The Sunset Hills Neighborhood Association (SHNA) has allotted funds to encourage the reforesting of our neighborhood. This program assists homeowners who are also members of the SHNA with the selection, siting, and purchase of ecologically-valuable trees. The trees available through this program will be native canopy trees with an emphasis on replacing the dominant Oak species of our region that also happens to be the symbol of our City of Greensboro, the White Oak. These tree species, though incredibly important to our local biodiversity, are not often found at retail nurseries. For optimal long-term health and longevity, trees will typically be in 3 gallon containers, depending on current availability from the local growers.

### SPECIAL NOTE & GUARANTEE :

*Canopy trees must be sited properly \* - never under overhead power lines or in locations too close to homes, driveways, sidewalks, etc. Homeowner must call 811 to locate utilities on their property prior to planting.*

*The Board is not liable for any damages. The homeowner will receive a tree(s) with the expectation that it will be cared for until established by maintaining a consistent watering schedule (1" per week for 2-3 years) and mulched correctly (no mulch volcanoes which cause damage). Should that tree not survive, a new tree may be ordered through the program, but the cost of that tree will be the responsibility of the homeowner.*
